This document describes the Dimensions RM integration with SparxSystems® Enterprise Architect.

The instructions in this document outline how to link Dimensions RM requirements to Enterprise Architect artifacts. These instructions assume that you are familiar with Enterprise Architect. If not, consult the documentation provided by SparxSystems. These instructions also assume that you know how to manipulate Dimensions RM instance information. If not, consult the *Dimensions RM User's Guide* and the *Dimensions RM Administrator's Guide*.

These instructions assume that both Enterprise Architect is already installed on your system and Dimensions RM is available in your network environment. See the *Dimensions RM Installation Guide* for information on installing Dimensions RM.

The instructions in this document are provided by Micro Focus for illustrative purposes only. The instructions have been verified only for the versions of Enterprise Architect specified in the platform matrix, which is available at <a href="https://www.microfocus.com/documentation/dimensions-rm/">https://www.microfocus.com/documentation/dimensions-rm/</a>. Other versions of Enterprise Architect may integrate with Dimensions RM in a similar manner, or a different manner, or not at all.

## **Prerequisites**

In order to integrate Dimensions RM and Enterprise Architect, the following conditions have to be met:

- Dimensions RM is installed, running and available in the network environment.
- You have the support tools (e.g. RM Manage) installed.
- Enterprise Architect is installed.
- On the machine running Enterprise Architect, .NET framework 4.0 is installed.
- The Dimensions RM add-in for Enterprise Architect is installed.

# **Configuring Dimensions RM**

In order to integrate Dimensions RM and Enterprise Architect, you need a class which represents the Enterprise Architect model. In this guide, the class to be linked is named *Model*, but you can use any name you like.

#### To create the Model class in Dimensions RM, follow these steps:

- 1 Start the Class Definition tool.
- 2 Right-click the background.
- **3** From the shortcut menu, select **Add Class | Model**.
- **4** Enter a name (e.g. *Model*) and press **Enter**.
- 5 Double-click the Model class.
- 6 Double-click the Model attribute.
- **7** Select the **Text** tab.
- **8** Ensure that the **HTML Formatting** box is selected and click **OK**.
- **9** Create these Alpha-Numeric attributes:
  - EA\_GUID
  - EA\_Project
  - EA\_Type
  - Model\_Version
- 10 Click OK.
- **11** Save the class definition.
- **12** Create links between the *Model* class and the requirement classes you want to link to.




Figure 1-1. Linked Classes in Dimensions RM Class Definition

# **Configuring the Dimensions RM Add-In for Enterprise Architect**

The current version supports creation and linking of requirements with elements from Enterprise Architect.



**CAUTION!** All linking and unlinking of requirements and artifacts **must** be done through the add-in. If you create a link directly in Dimensions RM, Enterprise Architect will not recognize this link and vice-versa. This also applies when unlinking.

# **Settings**

In order to integrate Dimensions RM and Enterprise Architect, the add-in needs to be configured.

To configure the add-in, follow these steps:

- 1 Open Enterprise Architect.
- Expand the EXTENSIONS menu in Enterprise Architect and select Specialize | Dimensions RM | Settings. This opens the Settings dialog.
- 3 Configure the **Dimensions RM Connection** settings by filling out these fields:
  - **Server**: The URL to the web server. The URL must match one of these formats:
    - http://<SERVER NAME>:<PORT> Example: http://rmserver:8080
    - https://<SERVER NAME>:<PORT> Example: https://rmserver:8443
  - **User Name**: The user name for connecting to Dimensions RM.
  - **Password**: The password associated to the user name.
  - Database: The database in which the instance resides.
  - **Instance**: The instance you want to use, e.g. RMDEMO.
  - **Class**: The name of class which references Enterprise Architect, e.g. *Model*. This is the class you created in chapter "Configuring Dimensions RM" on page 8.
- **4** Check if the data you entered are correct, by clicking the **Validate** button at the bottom of the window.
- **5** Configure the **Enterprise Architect** settings, by filling out these fields:
  - **Temp Image Folder**: Specifies the location where the exported diagram files from Enterprise Architect are stored before they are uploaded to Dimensions RM.
  - **Interconnection Port**: Specifies the port under which Enterprise Architect elements can be opened directly from the Dimensions RM web page.



**CAUTION!** The port needs to be identical for all Enterprise Architect installations as the port is used for the web link from Dimensions RM's *Model* class to Enterprise Architect's model. Changing the port makes the web links unusable.

- **System Output**: If selected, provides logging to the System Output view of Enterprise Architect.
- Dimensions RM Requirement Read-Only: If selected, Dimensions RM requirements are read-only in Enterprise Architect. This prevents that requirements can be changed from the Enterprise Architect project.
- 6 Click OK.



**TIP** In order to check if your **Connection** and **Enterprise Architect** settings are correct, click **Validate**.

### **Editing the Settings File**

#### Opening the Settings File for Editing

Enter the following into the location box of Windows Explorer: %APPDATA%\Dimensions RM\Enterprise Architect If your Windows user name is *Administrator*, this translates to C:\Users\*Administrator*\AppData\Roaming\Dimensions RM\Enterprise Architect.

**2** Open the file **user.config** with a text editor (e.g. Notepad).

#### Excluding Classes From the Class Selection Boxes

The user.config file contains two settings that can be used to exclude classes from class selection: **excludedClassNames** and **excludedClassTypeIDs**.

With the **excludedClassNames** setting, you can specify the classes to exclude by their names (e.g. Marketing\_Requirements). To specify several classes, use a comma as separator.

Please note that both settings, **excludedClassNames** and **excludedClassTypeIDs**, will exclude the specified classes from **any** Dimensions RM instance connecting to.

#### **Example:**

```
<add key="excludedClassNames" value="Tests,Defects" />
```

The setting **excludedTypeIDs** uses IDs that are constants in any version of Dimensions RM. These type IDs will exclude any class that was created from that type, no matter what their names are.

#### **Default type IDs:**

- 7: Comment (class for creating comments)
- **500:** Poll (class for creating polls)
- **501:** Chapter (class for creating documents)

#### **Example:**

```
<add key="excludedTypeIDs" value="7,500,501" />
```

### Marking a Package for Requirements

In order to link to Dimensions RM requirements, Enterprise Architect needs a package which contains the requirements from Dimensions RM.

#### To mark a package, follow these steps:

1 Open Enterprise Architect.

2 In Project Browser, create or select a package, e.g. *Dimensions RM Requirements*.




Figure 1-2. Project Browser with selected package.

3 Expand the EXTENSIONS menu in Enterprise Architect and select Specialize | Dimensions RM | Mark Requirement Package.



**NOTE** The package for requirements needs to be marked for each Enterprise Architect project.

# **Linking Requirements and Artifacts**

In the following chapters, artifact refers to an Enterprise Architect artifact and requirement refers to a Dimensions RM requirement.

A link is a connection between an artifact and a requirement. When creating a link, a copy of the artifact is created in Dimensions RM and a copy of the requirement is created in the package for requirements in Enterprise Architect.



**CAUTION!** Do not link requirements in the package for requirements with any Enterprise Architect artifact as these links will be removed when refreshing the requirement or artifact.

#### **Linking to an Existing Requirement**

Linking of Requirements is done in the Project Browser. To link an Enterprise Architect artifact and a requirement, follow these steps:

- 1 Open Enterprise Architect.
- 2 In Project Browser, right-click the Enterprise Architect artifact you want to link to a Dimensions RM requirement.




Figure 2-1. Project Browser with selected artifact

3 From the shortcut menu, select Specialize | Dimensions RM | Link Requirement. This opens the Link Requirement dialog.

**4** Select the requirement you want to create the link to.



**TIP** To guickly find a requirement, you can choose any or all of these options:

- Enter the name or part of it or a complete requirement ID into the search box.
- You can choose a class.
- You can choose a collection.

After making your choice, click **Search**.

Click Add Link. This starts the linking process. This creates a copy of the artifact in Dimensions RM and links it with the requirement. When the link process is completed the Link Requirement is marked with and the Dimensions RM requirement appears in the package configured in chapter "Marking a Package for Requirements" on page 11.

#### **Creating and Linking a Requirement**

To simplify the process of creating a requirement and linking it to an artifact, you can perform these actions in one step within Enterprise Architect.

#### To create and link the requirement, follow these steps:

- Open Enterprise Architect.
- 2 In Project Browser, right-click the artifact you want to link the new requirement to.
- 3 In the shortcut menu, select Specialize | Dimensions RM | Create & Link. This opens the Create Requirement dialog.
- **4** In the **Class** box, select the class of the requirement you wish to create.
- **5** Fill out the form as required.
- **6** Click **Create & Link**. This starts the process and closes the dialog.

#### **Unlinking Requirements**

If a link between a requirement and an artifact is no longer required, it can be removed from within Enterprise Architect. Note that this does not remove the artifact nor the requirement.

#### To unlink an artifact and a requirement, follow these steps:

- 1 Open Enterprise Architect.
- 2 In Project Browser, right-click the artifact you want to unlink.
- 3 In the shortcut menu, select Specialize | Dimensions RM | Unlink Requirement. This opens the Unlink Requirement dialog.
- **4** From the list of requirements, select the requirement you want to unlink.

#### 5 Click Delete Link.

## **Refreshing Artifacts and Requirements**

When working with Dimensions RM and Enterprise Architect it is common that data change in the requirement or in the artifact. When modifying an artifact, the copy in Dimensions RM needs to be updated. A modification of a requirement requires an update of the copy in Enterprise Architect.

Refreshing a model artifact updates all attributes in the model class in Dimensions RM with the attribute values of the artifact.

Refreshing a requirement updates all attribute values in the requirement in Enterprise Architect with the attribute values of the linked Dimensions RM requirement. Any Dimensions RM requirement which has been linked to an artifact in Dimensions RM will be copied to the package for requirements if it does not already exist.

In both cases, the links between the artifact and the requirement are updated by copying the links from Dimensions RM to Enterprise Architect. If links were deleted in Dimensions RM, they will also be deleted in Enterprise Architect.



**CAUTION!** Any link between a requirement in the package for requirements and an artifact which was not created through the Dimensions RM add-in for Enterprise Architect will be removed when refreshing the requirement or artifact.

#### To refresh data of an artifact or requirement, follow these steps:

- **1** Open Enterprise Architect.
- **2** In Project Browser, right-click the package, artifact, or requirement you want to refresh.
- **3** Select **Specialize | Dimensions RM | Refresh** from the shortcut menu.

The refresh is executed as a background task, which allows you to continue working with Enterprise Architect. Note that changes are not incorporated immediately. Progress information is written to the System Output tab **Dimensions RM**. Refresh is completed when a status message starting with **Finished Synchronisation...** is shown.

**TIP** To open the artifact, double-click the corresponding report line (see Figure 2-2).

# **Importing Requirements**

For reference, requirements from Dimensions RM can be imported into the package for requirements of Enterprise Architect. For further information about the package, see chapter "Marking a Package for Requirements" on page 11.

#### To import requirements, follow these steps:

- 1 Open Enterprise Architect.
- **2** In Project Browser, right-click the package for the requirements.
- From the shortcut menu, select Specialize |
  Dimensions RM | Import Requirements. This opens the Import Requirements
  dialog.
- **4** To filter requirements by text content, type a word or phrase that occurs in the title or description of the requirement.
- **5** Select one or a combination of the following:
  - Class: The class of the Dimensions RM requirements
  - Container: Click ... to open the Select Container dialog. Then, select the desired container from the Documents/Snapshots, Collections, or Baselines tab and click OK.
  - **Current Status:** Select **Current** to search for the most recent version of requirements, or **Proposed** to search for change requests.
- **6** Click **Search**. This lists all requirements to be imported.
- 7 If you want to overwrite previously imported requirements, select the **Overwrite** existing requirements check box.
- 8 Click **Import**.
- **9** Confirm the **Import Requirements** dialog to start importing the requirements.



#### **NOTES**

- **Import** imports all requirements in the list. To limit the number of requirements to be imported, add them into a collection. For further information about collections, see chapter "Managing Requirements in a Collection" in RM Browser User's Guide.
- **Import** does not overwrite (update) an existing requirement. To update a requirement see chapter "Refreshing Artifacts and Requirements" on page 16.

# **Publishing Models**

Publishing Models is suggested if you want to work with artifacts in Dimensions RM. Publishing a model copies the artifacts from Enterprise Architect to Dimensions RM.

#### **Publishing a Single Model**

#### To publish a single model, follow these steps:

- 1 Open Enterprise Architect.
- 2 In Project Browser, right-click an artifact.
- From the shortcut menu, select Specialize | Dimensions RM | Publish\_Model. This starts the publishing process. To check the status, open the System Output window.

#### **Publishing all Models of a Package**

#### To publish all models of a package, follow these steps:

- 1 Open Enterprise Architect.
- **2** In Project Browser, right-click an package.
- 3 From the shortcut menu, select Specialize | Dimensions RM | Publish\_Models in Package. This starts the publishing process for all models in the package. To check the status, open the System Output window.

# **Opening Requirements or Artifacts in Dimensions RM**

When working in Enterprise Architect, sometimes it may become necessary to work with the Dimensions RM requirement. You can open a requirement from your package for requirements if the associated artifact exists in Dimensions RM. To open the requirement in Dimensions RM, follow these steps:

- 1 Right-click a requirement or artifact.
- 2 Select Specialize | Dimensions RM | Open in Dimensions RM.

## **Finding Artifacts in Enterprise Architect**

When working in Dimensions RM, sometimes it may become necessary to work with the Enterprise Architect artifact. To find an Enterprise Architect artifact, follow these steps:

- **1** Ensure that Enterprise Architect is running.
- 2 You need to have access to the project file at the same path specified in the link.

- **3** Open the requirement in Dimensions RM. This opens the **Edit Attributes** dialog.
- **4** Expand the section which holds the description attribute. By default, this is the **Standard Attributes** section.
- **5** Click the **Find in Enterprise Architect** link. You find it within the description attribute.



**NOTE** Depending on your browser settings, a new tab or window will open and close. After the tab or window has closed, you can change to Enterprise Architect to access the artifact.
