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Introduction



Note: These release notes contain information that might not appear in the Help. Read them in their entirety before you install the product. This document may also contain a number of links to external Web sites. Micro Focus cannot be responsible for the contents of the Web site or for the contents of any site to which it might link. Web sites by their nature can change very rapidly and although we try to keep our links up-to-date, we cannot guarantee that they will always work as expected.

The Relativity product set enables the construction of a true relational database using existing COBOL application data. Relativity provides a full-featured, Windows Open Services Architecture (WOSA), Open Database Connectivity (ODBC)-compliant relational database engine. Thus, Relativity allows SQL-based client access to COBOL application data without moving, converting, replicating, or re-engineering COBOL data files.

With Relativity providing SQL-based access to COBOL data files, any ODBC-enabled database development application or tool can be chosen to build applications for ad hoc reporting, decision support, and specialized data processing functions. Relativity enables any working application to benefit from database technology without rewriting or migrating that application.

Relativity Products

The components detailed in the Relativity Components section are available within the following products:

Designer Suite

The Relativity Designer Suite is a Windows-only development tool which enables you to create Relativity databases. The Suite consists of the following components - the Designer, the Database Administrator, and the Data Manager.

You can import COBOL file record definitions into the database, and then create tables based on those record definitions.

Use the Database Administrator to maintain such things as the table connections, date constants, and character sets used in a Relativity database.

Relativity for Windows Workstations

Relativity for Windows Workstations is Windows-only run-time product and is a single-tier solution required when your ODBC application and COBOL data files reside on the same machine, and the ODBC application is a 32-bit program. Relativity for Windows Workstations requires a Relativity database that was developed using the Designer Suite.

Relativity for Windows Workstations contains the following components - Database Administrator and the Data Manager.

Use the Database Administrator to maintain such things as the table connections, date constants, and character sets used in a Relativity database.

Data Server

The Relativity Data Server is a run-time product which contains the Data Server for a specific platform (Windows or UNIX), and also a platform-specific Data Client.

It is a client/server solution required when your ODBC application is required to access COBOL data files that reside on another machine, or when your ODBC application is a 64-bit program. The Relativity Data Server requires a Relativity database that was developed using the Relativity Designer Suite.

This product also contains a Java Client, which is part of the client/server solution required by JDBC (Java Database Connectivity) applications.

Relativity Components

The Relativity product set consists of three main software components:

Relativity Designer

The Relativity Designer is an interactive, Windows-based tool that enables the COBOL application developer to define and maintain a relational database system of tables using COBOL data.

The Relativity Designer creates the Relativity catalog by performing the following functions:

- Automatically extracts the definitions of data files from the COBOL programs into the Relativity catalog.
- Collects information regarding the data from the application developer.
- Allows the developer to define relational tables from existing COBOL data items within records of existing COBOL files.

If an owner group has been assigned to the catalog, only users who are members of that owner group may open the data source associated with the catalog using the Relativity Designer. Assignment of an owner thus protects the sensitive data in the catalog exposed by the Relativity Designer from access by users who are not owners. A password-protected log on procedure validates user identities whenever a Relativity data source is opened, as explained in Providing Data Security.

Relativity DBA

The Relativity DBA (Database Administrator) is an interactive, Windows-based tool that enables the system administrator at the end-user location to maintain and manage the Relativity database and the security of the Relativity database.

The Relativity DBA provides the following functions:

- Defining and authorizing users of the database.
- Restricting the view of the data for individual groups of users.
- Maintaining the linkages between tables and physical COBOL data files.
- Defining date constants.
- Merging security and connection information into a new catalog (an optional function controlled by the catalog developer).
- Producing reports on security and connections.

The Relativity DBA can be used only by users who have the **Use Administrator** privilege set for the catalog, or by the catalog owner (who has all privileges set by default). The owner may grant this privilege to one or more administrative groups - see Defining Group Privileges.

Relativity Database Management System

The Relativity Database Management System (DBMS) connects Windows client-based tool products to COBOL data files. It processes SQL requests from the ODBC-enabled application (or tool) and performs the necessary actions to respond to the request with data obtained from the COBOL data files.

The Relativity DBMS comes in two variants: single-tier and a client/server. The single-tier product is named the Relativity Data Manager. The client/server product is named the Relativity Data Client and Relativity Data Server.

Relativity Data Manager

The Relativity Data Manager is a single-tier version of the Relativity DBMS. By single-tier, we mean that the product is installed on a single machine. In this configuration, the COBOL data files are installed on the same machine as the ODBC-enabled application and the Relativity Data Manager.

Relativity Data Client and Relativity Data Server

The Relativity Data Client and Relativity Data Server are a client/server version of the Relativity DBMS. In this configuration, the COBOL data files are typically not on the same machine as the ODBC-enabled application. In this case, the Relativity Data Client is installed on the same machine as the ODBC-enabled application, and the Relativity Data Server is installed on the same machine as the COBOL data files. The Data Server needs to be installed only once and on only the server machine, that is, the machine with the COBOL data files. The Data Client needs to be installed on each client machine that needs access to the data on the server machine. The Data Client sends the SQL requests from the ODBC-enabled application to the Data Server, which then processes the requests and returns only the resulting rows to the Data Client, which in turn returns them to the ODBC-enabled application.

What's New

New Designer user interface

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The Relativity Designer has been redesigned with modern user interfaces. The original Designer has been renamed to the Classic Designer and will also be installed in this release, and you can continue to use it; however, we encourage you to transition to the new interface, as the Classic Designer is expected to be removed in a subsequent release.

64-bit Data Server support for SUSE

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The Relativity Data Server for SUSE has been updated to run as a 64-bit process on SUSE 12. The RUNACTIVE script will determine if a 32-bit or 64-bit COBOL (either Visual COBOL or Server Express) is in use and launch the appropriate Data Server.

SQL_C_SBIGINT and SQL_C_UBIGINT support

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The ODBC 3 Relativity Data Manager and Data Client (but not the Relativity Data Manager for ADO, nor the Relativity Data Client for ADO) now support 64-bit C integers SQL_C_SBIGINT and SQL_C_UBIGINT.



Note: This does not include support for 64-bit (BIGINT) columns; however, DECIMAL(20,0) columns will contain a SQL C SBIGINT.

Foreign key support

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Relativity has been enhanced to support the ODBC API call SQLForeignKeys. The new Designer has the ability to designate a connection between columns in two different tables, creating foreign keys. These are columns that you usually use in joins. Adding this information allows SQL tools to optimize queries that they generate, and to present the foreign key association graphically.



Note: It is up to the SQL tool to make use of this information; Relativity does not directly use it, nor validate it. It is up to the database designer to make valid associations.

New documentation: Relativity Data Server Utilities on UNIX

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New documentation is now available for the RelServerAdmin, RelClientAdmin, RelClientTest, and RelDriverAdmin utilities on UNIX. Support for Net Express and Server Express

You can now install and Relativity with either Micro Focus Net Express or Server Express.

See *Software Requirements* in these Release Notes for information about which versions of Net Express and Server Express are supported.

COBOL syntax files

The **COBOL FD Importer** within Relativity Designer invokes the COBOL compiler to generate information about a COBOL program's File Definition and saves it to COBOL syntax file. The wizard then reads the information from that file and imports it into the Relativity catalog.

The COBOL syntax files have a different extension based on which Micro Focus product you have installed Relativity for:

- .CST, if you use Relativity with either Visual COBOL or Enterprise Developer
- .RST, if you use Relativity with either Net Express or Server Express

A new ODBC driver

This release provides a new Relativity ODBC driver which is optimized for ADO support.

When you use Relativity with an ADO application, it is strongly recommended to use the ADO version of Relativity. To do this:

1. Open the ODBC Administrator and click Add.

This displays a list of all ODBC drivers installed on your machine.

- **2.** Select a driver that is appropriate for your environment:
 - Micro Focus Relativity Data Manager for ADO (32-bit)
 - Micro Focus Relativity Data Client for ADO (32-bit)
 - Micro Focus Relativity Data Client for ADO (64-bit)

System requirements

Hardware requirements

The requirements for this Relativity product are in addition to the requirements of the Micro Focus product you have installed - either Visual COBOL, Enterprise Developer, Net Express or Server Express. See the in-product documentation for details of the respective product's requirements.

Operating systems supported

This product operates on the following platforms:

- AIX 6.1 and 7.1 on PowerPC with Server Express, and AIX 7.2 with Visual COBOL.
- Red Hat 5.5 through to 7.x on x86.
- SUSE SLES 11 through to 12 SP4 on x86 and x64.
- Windows 7 to Server 2012 R2, and everything in between.

Software requirements

This Relativity product requires one of the following Micro Focus COBOL development products.

- Visual COBOL or Enterprise Developer (including Development Hub and UNIX Components variants), version 5 or later.
- Enterprise Test Server, version 5 or later.
- Net Express or Server Express 5.1 Update 18.

Other requirements

This product requires the latest version of the Micro Focus licensing software.

If you have one of the products listed above installed locally, you do not need to install the licensing software separately, as the product setup file also installs a new license server on the same machine.

If your license server is on the network, you must update it before installing your Relativity product, because the client is not able to communicate with license servers of versions older than 10000.2.660. Check the version of your license server by running the Micro Focus Licensing System Administration tool and selecting **Help** > **About** (Windows) or option **8 - Get License Details** (UNIX).

You can download the required version of the license server software from the Micro Focus SupportLine Web site: http://supportline.microfocus.com.

Additional software requirements

To ensure full functionality for some Visual COBOL or Enterprise Developer features, you might be required to obtain and install third-party software in addition to the prerequisite software installed automatically by the product setup file.

Compiling Java

Refer to the Additional Software Requirements in the product documentation supplied with the COBOL product being used; this will stipulate the minimum required version of Java Development Kit (JDK) required to compile Java, if required, during the import and update processes.

JDBC Support

Refer to the Software Requirements in the product documentation supplied with the COBOL product being used; this will stipulate the minimum required version of Java Platform, Enterprise Edition (Java EE) required to execute the Java Client and develop a JDBC application.

Downloading the product

Use the download links in your Electronic Product Delivery email to download the required Relativity products.

For more information, follow the same links for the installation instructions and the End User License Agreement.

Restrictions and requirements

Before starting the installation on Windows, you should consider the following:

- If, when you install a Relativity product, the machine does not have the correct version of the Microsoft Visual C++ Redistributable Run-time already installed, it is installed as part of the Visual COBOL, Enterprise Developer, or Net Express install. This installation adds a number of .dll files, without digital signatures, into the winsxs directory.
- Your account must have administrative permissions to install this product. If your account does not have these permissions and cannot obtain them, you will be asked to provide the credentials of an administrator during the installation.

Installing Relativity Data Server



Note: Before installing, see *Restrictions and Requirements*.

This version of the product is a full install.

What to install

You need to install the following files, in the following order:

 The Data Server install file - DataServerx86.msi (Windows) or setup_dataserver_version_platform_x86_64 (UNIX). See Data Server installation.

- The Data Client install file appropriate to your system DataClientx86.msi, DataClientx64.msi (both Windows) or setup_dataclient_version_platform_x86_64 (UNIX). See Data Client installation.
- The Java Client install file if you plan to use JDBC applications jclient.zip. See Java Client Installation.

Data Server installation

The Data Server is one of the core pieces of the Relativity product; either Data Server or Data Manager must be installed in order to use any of the Relativity products.

A Data Server is required in situations where the data files are located on a different machine from the ODBC application, or if the ODBC application is a 64-bit program. When you install the Data Server, it is also necessary to install a Data Client to communicate with it. While the Data Server itself is a 32-bit program, you require a 64-bit Data Client to enable 64-bit ODBC applications to communicate with the Data Server, even if it is installed on the same machine as the ODBC application.

The Data Server requires an installation of one of the following products in order to access data files -Visual COBOL, Enterprise Developer, Net Express (on Windows) or Server Express (on UNIX).

If the Data Server is to be used with the Relativity Designer Suite in order to develop Relativity catalogs, one of the prerequisite products listed earlier must also be installed either on the same machine as the Data Server, or on the machine on which the Designer is installed (see Location of the data files for more information). If either Visual COBOL, Enterprise Developer, Net Express or Server Express is not installed on the machine with the Data Server, then one of these products must be installed on the same machine as the Relativity Designer.

To install the Relativity Data Server on Windows:

- 1. Before installing the Data Server, ensure that the Micro Focus COBOL product you are installing Relativity for is installed and licensed.
- 2. Run DataServerx86.msi and follow the wizard instructions to install the prerequisite software and the product.
- 3. Install a Relativity license using the Micro Focus License Administration tool; see Installing licenses for more information.

Following installation of the Data Server, install a Data Client (see Data Client installation), after which you should follow the instructions in the Data Server verification and Data Client verification sections.

To install the Relativity Data Server on UNIX:

- 1. Before installing the Data Server, ensure that the Micro Focus COBOL product you are installing Relativity for is installed and licensed.
- 2. Ensure you are logged on with root privileges.
- 3. Depending on the prerequisite product you have installed, do one of the following:
 - If you have Visual COBOL or Enterprise Developer installed, execute cobsetenv to set up the Visual COBOL or Enterprise Developer environment:
 - . /opt/microfocus/VisualCOBOL/bin/cobsetenv
 - If you have Server Express installed, set COBDIR, PATH and Library Path to your Server Express installation.
- **4.** Change the setup file ./setup_dataserver_version_platform_x86_64 to be executable: chmod a+x ./setup_dataserver_version_platform_x86_64
- **5.** Run ./setup_dataserver_version_platform_x86_64 and follow the on-screen instructions.
- 6. Install a Relativity license using the Micro Focus License Administration tool; see Installing licenses for more information.

Following installation of the Data Server, install a Data Client (see Data Client installation), after which you should follow the instructions in the Data Server verification and Data Client verification sections.

To start the Data Server:

Use the following commands to start the Data Server after installation:

Windows:

The Data Server is installed as a service and is set to start when Windows starts. Configure this behavior from the Windows Services Manager.

UNIX:

Ensuring that you have root privileges, run the following command:

. /opt/microfocus/DataServer/RUNACTIVE

Data Client installation

A Data Client is required to communicate with a Data Server. The following versions of the Data Client are available:

- A 32-bit version and a 64-bit version for Windows
- A 32-bit version and a 64-bit version for UNIX

Install a Data Client on the machine containing the ODBC application, which is typically on a different machine from the Data Server with which it communicates, but there are two exceptions:

- On Windows, if an 64-bit ODBC application is in use, a Data Server and a 64-bit Data Client must be installed on the same machine to support the 64-bit ODBC application;
- On UNIX, if the ODBC application and the data files both reside on the same machine, both a Data Server and a Data Client must be installed on the same machine, as there is not a Relativity Data Manager available on UNIX.

A Data Client does not require any of the following Micro Focus COBOL products to be installed on the same machine as it does not access the data files directly - Visual COBOL, Enterprise Developer, Net Express, Server Express, COBOL Server, Enterprise Server or Micro Focus Server.

To install a 32-bit Data Client on Windows:

- 1. Run DataClientx86.msi and follow the wizard instructions to install prerequisite software and the product.
- 2. After installation of a Data Client, run the Relativity Server Administrator from the Control Panel to define any Data Servers that the Data Client needs to access:
 - a. From the Windows Start menu, select Control Panel.

Note: If the Control Panel is displaying Category view, switch to Icon view.

- b. Start the Micro Focus Relativity Server Admin (32-bit).
- c. To define a Data Server, on the Select Server screen, click New, enter the network name of where the Data Server resides, and the port number to use to connect, and then click OK.
- 3. Following installation of the Data Client, you should follow the instructions in the Data Server verification and Data Client verification sections to create the necessary data sources.

To install a 64-bit Data Client on Windows:

- 1. Run DataClientx64.msi and follow the wizard instructions to install prerequisite software and the product.
- 2. After installation of the Data Client, run the Relativity Server Administrator from the Control Panel to define any Data Servers that the Data Client needs to access:

From the Windows Start menu, select Control Panel.



Note: If the Control Panel is displaying **Category** view, switch to **Icon** view.

- b. Double-click Micro Focus Relativity Server Admin.
- c. To define a Data Server, on the Select Server screen, click New, enter the network name of where the Data Server resides, and the port number to use to connect, and then click **OK**.
- 3. On completion of the Data Client installation, follow the instructions in the Data Server verification and Data Client verification sections to create the necessary data sources.

To install a 32-bit Data Client on UNIX:

- 1. Ensure you are logged on with *root* privileges.
- 2. Change the setup file to be executable with the following command:

```
chmod a+x setup_dataclient_version_platform_x86_64
```

3. Run setup_dataclient_version_platform_x86_64 and follow the on-screen instructions.

```
./setup_dataclient_version_platform_x86_64
```

In order to complete the installation of a Data Client, it is necessary to install an ODBC driver manager, such as iODBC or unixODBC.

- 4. If necessary, download and install one of the aforementioned driver managers.
- 5. Enter the commands below:
 - a. PATH=\$PATH:/opt/microfocus/DataClient/bin
 - b. LD_LIBRARY_PATH=\$LD_LIBRARY_PATH:/opt/microfocus/DataClient/lib:/usr/lib
 - c. export PATH LD_LIBRARY_PATH
 - d. reldriveradmin --install-driver --directory /opt/microfocus/DataClient/lib
- 6. If necessary, add a rule to the firewall manager to open TCP/IP on port 1583.
- 7. On completion of the Data Client installation, follow the instructions in the Data Server verification and Data Client verification sections to create the necessary data sources.

Java Client installation

The Relativity Java Client is intended to provide access to a Relativity Server data source from a Java JDBC application.

To install the Java Client on Windows and UNIX:

1. Unzip jclient.zip to a directory that is accessible to your JDBC application; this should be a directory on the CLASSPATH.

This directory is one in which the Java runtime environment or web server will have access.

2. After the installation, follow the directions in relidbo.htm to complete the installation.

Installation verification

By verifying the installation of each product in the Relativity Data Server, you also undertake the initial setup.

The following instructions assume that you have run all required product installations for Relativity Data Server. It is useful to have an ODBC-enabled application, such as Microsoft Access, also installed to fully verify the installation.

Data Server verification


The following instructions enable you to create the server data source used by the client ODBC applications. You only need to create the server data source once, from one of your clients. It is preferable to do this from a Windows client, but if you do not have any Windows clients, follow the instructions in the UNIX section.

Windows:

The following instructions assume the 32-bit Data Client is being used on a 64-bit Windows machine, and are applicable if you are connecting to a Data Server on both a Windows or a UNIX platform.


- 1. On the Data Client machine, open the **Control Panel**.
- 2. If the Control Panel is displaying in Category view, change to Icons view.
- 3. Double-click Micro Focus Relativity Server Admin (32-bit) to start it.
- 4. If the User Account Control message box appears, click Yes.

The Select Server screen appears.




5. Click New.

The **New Server** screen appears.




6. Enter the network name of the Data Server to use. If necessary, change the Port Number field to the correct port number (the default is 1583). Click OK.

If you have entered the correct details, the **Data Sources** screen appears.



7. Click Add.

The Relativity screen appears.



- 8. In the Data Source Name field, enter Verify.
- 9. Click Select Catalog.

The **Select Catalog for Data Source** screen appears.

10.Do one of the following:

- If connecting to a Windows server, navigate to %PUBLIC%\Documents\Micro Focus \Relativity Data Server\Samples\MF\Verify, select verify.rcg, and then click OK.
- If connecting to a UNIX server, navigate to samples/mf/verify, select verify.rcg, and then click OK.

The **Relativity** screen appears.

11.Click OK.

12.Click Close twice to close the Data Sources and the Select Server screens.

After you have created the server data source, you must create a client data source on each client machine; see Data Client verification.

UNIX:

If you only have UNIX data clients, you must create the server data source from the Data Server itself. On the command line, enter the following:

- 1. PATH=\$PATH:/opt/microfocus/DataServer/2.3.0/bin
- 2. LD_LIBRARY_PATH=\$LD_LIBRARY_PATH:/opt/microfocus/DataServer/2.3.0/ lib:/usr/lib
- 3. export PATH LD LIBRARY PATH
- 4. relserveradmin --add-data-source Verify --server-name ServerName.1583 -catalog demo/cobol/verify/verify.rcg --type MF

After you have created the server data source, you must create a client data source on each client machine; see Data Client verification.


Data Client verification

Follow these instructions on each data client after you have created the server data source, as detailed in Data Server verification.

Windows:

1. Open the ODBC Administrator (see *Locating the ODBC Administrator*).

The ODBC Data Source Administrator screen appears.




2. Click Add.

The Create New Data Source screen appears.

3. Select Micro Focus Relativity Data Client from the list of drivers, and then click Finish.

The ODBC Relativity C/S Setup screen appears.



4. In the Data Source Name field, enter Verify, then in the Server Name list box, select the name used to create the Verify server data source (which you created in Data Server verification).

A Server DSN list box appears, listing the server data source names on the server.

- 5. Select **Verify**, and then click **OK**.
- 6. Click OK again to close the ODBC Data Source Administrator screen.



Note: In this example, the names of the server data source and the client data source are the same; whilst this is a helpful technique, it is not a requirement.

At this point, the Relativity driver has been loaded, it has opened a Relativity catalog, and a Relativity database has been created. This has very thoroughly exercised the installation; however, as an extra step, start a 32-bit ODBC application, open the Verify data source, and then execute the following SQL query:

SELECT * FROM BACKORDER

The result should show the BACKORDER table that started life as a COBOL data file.

UNIX:

On the command line of your UNIX data client, enter the following:

- 1. PATH=\$PATH:/opt/microfocus/DataClient/bin
- 2. LD_LIBRARY_PATH=\$LD_LIBRARY_PATH:/opt/microfocus/DataClient/lib:/usr/lib
- 3. export PATH LD_LIBRARY_PATH
- **4.** relclientadmin --add-data-source Verify --server-name ServerName.1583 --server-data-source-name Verify --type S



Note: In this example, the names of the server data source name and the client data source are the same; whilst this is a helpful technique, it is not a requirement.

Locating the ODBC Administrator

The Windows ODBC Administrator is an important utility due to its role of creating data sources. You must open the correct version of the ODBC Administrator appropriate to the bitism of data source that you require.

Windows 7

On a 32-bit Windows machine:

- 1. From the Start menu, open the Control Panel.
- **2.** Do one of the following:
 - If the Control Panel is displaying in **Category** view, select **System and Security**, and then **Administrative Tools**.
 - If the Control Panel is displaying in Icons view, select Administrative Tools.
- 3. Double-click Data Sources (ODBC).

The ODBC Data Source Administrator screen appears.

On a 64-bit Windows machine:

Creating a 32-bit data source for the Relativity Data Manager or the Relativity 32-bit Data Client requires a 32-bit ODBC administrator on 64-bit Windows. Unfortunately, that is not the default ODBC administrator on a 64-bit Windows 7 machine. To start the required ODBC Administrator, follow one of the procedures below:

- To open the 32-bit ODBC Administrator:
 - 1. From the Start menu, in the Search programs and files box, type odbc.
 - 2. In the results box, double-click ODBC Data Source Administrator (32-bit).

The **ODBC Data Source Administrator** screen appears.

Tip: To speed up access to this utility, right-click ODBC Data Source Administrator (32-bit) and select Pin to Taskbar or Pin to Start Menu.

- To open the 64-bit ODBC Administrator:
 - 1. From the Start menu, open the Control Panel.
 - 2. Do one of the following:
 - If the Control Panel is displaying in Category view, select System and Security, and then Administrative Tools.
 - If the Control Panel is displaying in Icons view, select Administrative Tools.
 - 3. Double-click Data Sources (ODBC).

The ODBC Data Source Administrator screen appears.

Windows 10 and later

You start the desired ODBC Administrator from the **Start** menu - locate the **Administrative Tools** group (from the **Start** menu, you can start to type the group name and the option should appear), and then select ODBC Data Sources (32-bit) or ODBC Data Sources (64-bit), depending on the type of data source to maintain.

Post-installation considerations

The steps you must perform after installation depend upon the location of the data files.

Location of data files

- If the data files exist on a Windows machine, and the 32-bit ODBC application is installed on the same machine, you only need to create a data source using the Windows ODBC administrator.
- If the data files exist on a Windows machine, and the 64-bit ODBC application is installed on the same machine, you must create a server data source using the Data Server for Windows, and then create a client data source using the 64-bit Data Client that references the server data source. (There is not a 64-bit Data Manager.)
- If the data files exist on a Windows machine that is separate from the ODBC application, you must create a server data source on the Windows machine containing the data files, install the Data Client on each client machines containing the ODBC application, and then create a client data source on each that references the server data source.
- If the data files exist on a UNIX machine, you must create a server data source on the UNIX machine containing the data files, install the Data Client on each machine containing the ODBC application, and then create a client data source on each that references the server data source. (There is not a singletier Data Manager for UNIX.)

Uninstalling

Windows - all components

To uninstall one or more Relativity products from Windows:

- 1. Log in with the same user ID you used when you installed the product.
- 2. From the Start menu, open the Control Panel.
- **3.** Do one of the following:
 - If the Control Panel is displaying in Category view, click Uninstall a program under Programs.
 - If the Control Panel is displaying in **Icons** view, double-click **Programs and Features**.

- 4. Select one of the following products and click Remove or Uninstall:
 - Micro Focus Relativity Data Client (32-bit)
 - Micro Focus Relativity Data Client (64-bit)
 - · Micro Focus Relativity Data Server
- 5. Click Yes to confirm.
- **6.** If required, repeat from step 4 to uninstall further products.

This process only removes files that the installation software installed. If the product directory has not been removed, delete any unwanted files and sub-directories within it using Windows Explorer. The following folders might not be removed:

- The Micro Focus product name folder in the Start menu you can delete this manually.
- %systemdrive%\Users\Public\Documents\Micro Focus this includes the binaries and the log files of the samples you have built.
- %ProgramData%\Micro Focus this includes some data files used by the Micro Focus licensing tool.
- %Program Files%\Micro Focus you can delete this manually.

Some registry entries are also not removed by the uninstallation process and you need to manually delete them.

To uninstall a product from the command line, you need the installation file, and you need to execute the following command:

```
msiexec /x install-file.msi
```

UNIX - Micro Focus Relativity Data Server

To uninstall the Micro Focus Relativity Data Server on UNIX:

1. Log in as root, and change directory to the Relativity Data Server's installation directory with the following commands:

```
cd /opt/microfocus/DataServer
cd `cat .active`
```

2. If the Data Server to be uninstalled is currently running, stop it with the following command:

3. Finally, perform the uninstall with the following commands:

```
`cat .active`/bin/Uninstall_Relativity_DataServerx.y.sh
```

where x.y represents the version number.

UNIX - Micro Focus Relativity Data Client

To uninstall the Micro Focus Relativity Data Client on UNIX:

1. Log in as root, and change directory to the Relativity Data Client's installation directory with the following commands:

```
cd /opt/microfocus/DataClient/bin
```

2. Perform the uninstall with the following command:

```
Uninstall_Relativity_DataClientx.y.sh
```

where x.y represents the version number.

Licensing information

To use Relativity, you need to purchase and install a license for it. To buy a license, contact your sales representative or Micro Focus SupportLine.

In addition, the Micro Focus product you have installed Relativity for (either Visual COBOL, Enterprise Developer, Net Express, Server Express, Enterprise Server, COBOL Server, or Micro Focus Server) must also be licensed with its own license.



Note:

- If you have purchased a license for a previous release of Relativity, that license will also enable you to use this release.
- Your entitlement for using this product is governed by the Micro Focus End User License Agreement and by your product order. If you are unsure of what your license entitlement is or if you wish to purchase additional licenses, contact your sales representative or Micro Focus SupportLine.

Relativity uses the Micro Focus License Administration software for installing and managing your Micro Focus licenses. See the instructions in the following sections about how to install the Relativity license.

To start Micro Focus License Administration

Windows

Windows 8.1

From the Windows Start screen, click the License Administration tile

Windows 10 and Later .

From your Windows desktop, click Start > Micro Focus License Manager > License Administration

UNIX

Log on as root, and from a command prompt type:

/var/microfocuslicensing/bin/cesadmintool.sh

Installing licenses

You need either a license file (with a .mflic extension) or an authorisation code which consists of a string of 16 alphanumeric characters.

If you have a license file

Windows

- 1. Start Micro Focus License Administration.
- 2. Click the Install tab.
- 3. Do one of the following:
 - · Click Browse next to the License file field and select the license file (which has an extension of .mflic).

- Drag and drop the license file from Windows Explorer to the License file field.
- · Open the license file in a text editor, such as Notepad, then copy and paste the contents of the file into the box below the License file field.
- 4. Click Install Licenses.

UNIX

- 1. Start the Micro Focus License Administration tool and select the Manual License Installation option by entering 4.
- 2. Enter the name and location of the license file.

If you have an authorization code

Authorizing your product when you have an Internet connection



Note:

It is not possible to install licenses remotely. You must be logged into the machine on which you are installing the licenses.

The following procedure describes how to authorize your product using a local or network license server. The license server is set up automatically when you first install the product.

Windows

- 1. Start Micro Focus License Administration.
- Click the Install tab.
- 3. Type the authorization code in the Enter authorization code field.
- 4. Click Authorize.

If you change the name of the machine running your license server after it has granted licenses, the licenses stop working.

UNIX

- 1. Start Micro Focus License Administration.
- 2. Select the Online Authorization option by entering 1 and pressing Enter.
- 3. Enter your authorization code at the Authorization Code prompt and then press Enter.

Authorizing your product when you don't have an Internet connection

This method of authorization is required if the machine you want to license does not have an Internet connection or if normal (automatic) authorization fails.

Windows

- 1. Start Micro Focus License Administration.
- 2. Click Manual Authorization on the Install page.
- 3. Make a note of the contents of the Machine ID field. You will need this later.
- 4. Do one of the following:
 - If your machine has an Internet connection, click the SupportLine Web link in the Manual Authorization Information window.
 - If your machine does not have an Internet connection, make a note of the Web address and type it into a Web browser on a machine that has an Internet connection.

The Micro Focus SupportLine Manual product authorization Web page is displayed.

- 5. Type the authorization code in the **Authorization Code** field. The authorization code is a 16-character alphanumeric string supplied when you purchased your product.
- 6. Type the Machine ID in the Machine ID field.

- 9. Copy the generated license string (or copy it from the email) and paste it into the box under the License file field on the Install page.
- 10.Click Install Licenses.

UNIX

In order to authorize your product you must have the following:

- Access to a computer which is connected to the Internet.
- Your authorization code (a 16-character alphanumeric string).
- The machine ID. To get this, start the Micro Focus License Administration tool and select the Get **Machine Id** option by inputting 6. Make a note of the "Old machine ID".

If you have previously received the licenses and put them in a text file, skip to step 6.

- 1. Open the Micro Focus license activation web page http://supportline.microfocus.com/activation in a
- 2. Enter your authorization code and old machine ID and, optionally, your email address in the Email Address field.
- 3. Click Generate.
- **4.** Copy the licenses strings from the web page or the email you receive into a file.
- **5.** Put the license file onto your target machine.
- 6. Start the Micro Focus License Administration tool and select the Manual License Installation option by inputting 4.
- 7. Enter the name and location of the license file.
